RESEARCH: I study Asian diasporas in the United States, East Asia, and Southeast Asia. I examine how these distributed and diverse communities of migrants and their offspring produce and transmit their experiences, material cultures, and cultural practices across time and space through multigenerational relationships, fictive kinship, and professional networks transnationally. My research includes the analysis of gendered narratives about displacement and migration in a wide array of activities and sources: family letters, cultural heritage organizations, food practices at home and in restaurants, and art/craft-making in both Japanese American incarceration camps during WWII and Asian American sororities in the twentieth century. I collect oral histories and conduct archival research and ethnographic fieldwork.

In addition to my written scholarship, I am the writer/director/editor of several documentary films, including the award-winning *Homecoming* about the migration of my family from Malaysia to America. My films have screened locally, nationally, and internationally at film festivals, academic conferences, art galleries, public libraries, and on television. I have received numerous fellowships, grants, and awards from organizations and institutions such as the American Library Association, University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA) Institute for American Cultures, and American Anthropology Association; and given over fifty invited workshop presentations internationally, including Korea, Taiwan, Canada, and the United States. I have contributed to books, journals, and encyclopedias in the areas of Asian American studies, archival science, and gender studies.

TEACHING: I have over fifteen years teaching experience in higher education. I was a teaching assistant for the Film and Asian American Studies Departments at UCLA when I was in graduate school at UCLA in the School of Theater, Film, & TV and School of Education and Information Studies. I became the Assistant Director of the UCLA Asian American Studies Center, Center for EthnoCommunications and was a lecturer in the Asian American Studies Department where I taught video ethnography and documentary filmmaking classes to undergraduate and graduate students. Many of the films the students made in my classes have screened in film festivals and shown in other Asian American studies courses at UCLA. Students from my classes have gone
